## The Status of Women in Wisconsin, 2015: Highlights

Women in Wisconsin have made considerable advances in recent years but still face inequities that often prevent them from reaching their full potential. Since the 2004 Status of Women in the States report was published, the gender wage gap in Wisconsin has narrowed, a higher percentage of women have bachelor's degrees, and women are more likely to work in managerial or professional occupations. Yet, as in all other states, women in Wisconsin are less likely than men to be in the labor force and more likely to live in poverty. Women also continue to be underrepresented in the state legislature.


If current trends continue, women in Wisconsin will not see equal pay until the year 2068 .*

## Key Findings

- Wisconsin's best grades are in the areas of employment and earnings, health and well-being, and political participation, for which it receives a C+. Its worst grade is in reproductive rights, for which it gets a D+.
- Wisconsin women who work full-time, year-round earn 78 cents on the dollar compared with similarly employed men.
- Approximately 27.8 percent of those working in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields in Wisconsin are women, compared with 28.8 percent nationwide.
- As of 2015, there are no women of color in statewide elective executive office in Wisconsin, and only one woman of color from the state in the

- Women in Wisconsin who are unionized earn \$141 more per week, on average, than those who are not represented by a union.
- Approximately 28.8 percent of women in Wisconsin have a bachelor's degree or higher, an increase of about 7 percentage points since 2000 .
- In 2012-2013, 72.4 percent of Wisconsin's four-year-olds were enrolled in state pre-K, preschool special education, or state and federal Head Start.
- Heart disease is the biggest killer of women in the United States. Wisconsin ranks 24 of 51 with a mortality rate of 125.0 per 100,000 .
